

Mandatory Summer Reading
Rising 3rd, 4th, 5th Graders
Scholastic Summer Reading Challenge 2016

This summer, rising 3rd, 4th, and 5th Graders will participate in the Scholastic Summer Reading Challenge, an online reading program, where children log their reading minutes. We will participate in this program **beginning on June 1st and ending on September 9th, 2016.**

There is no required book to read. Please visit a library or bookstore and assist your child in selecting books on their reading level. **Participation in this program is required. Students will receive a 1st Quarter Reading test grade based on the number of minutes they have logged on the Scholastic Summer Challenge website by September 9th, 2016.** As students log their number of reading minutes, they will unlock stories from some favorite authors, earn digital rewards and learn about new books to read. You'll also find tips to motivate your child and book recommendations in the parent section on the Scholastic Summer Reading Challenge website.

Here's how it works:

- Each time your child reads throughout the summer, write down the number of minutes spent reading.
- Keep a record of books read by recording the titles on the back of this page. Use loose-leaf or copy the page for additional space.
- At least once a week, you or your child should login to www.scholastic.com/summer using the Username and Password found below and enter the number of minutes your child has read.
- The chart below will help you and your child set goals and will be used to determine your child's grade:

Based on 5 days per week , if your child reads:	The minimum number of minutes they will have read by Sept. 9 th will be:	And they will earn a test grade of:
5-10 minutes per day	363	C (77-84)
15-20 minutes per day	1,088	B (85-89)
25-30 minutes per day	1,813	B (89-92)
35-40 minutes per day	2,538	A (93-96)
45 or more minutes per day	3,263	A (97-100)

Lastly, be a role model, and read along with your child. The time and effort you put in will make for a successful school year ahead. Happy Summer Reading!
